




Regulatory Structures

- Central Bank for Financial Institutions in all Countries
- Jamaica
 - Financial Services Commission for Securities, Pensions, Insurance
- Trinidad & Tobago
 - TTSEC for Securities
 - Central Bank Also for Pensions, Insurance and Credit Unions
- Barbados
 - Securities Commission for Securities



Legal Framework

- British Common Law Systems
- Significantly Influenced by Ontario Approaches
- Members of IOSCO
 - Subscribe to IOSCO Principles and Objectives of Securities Regulation
- Developing Regulatory Cooperation Within the Region



Market Structures

- Stock Exchanges and Depositories Regulated as SROs
- Automated Trading Systems
- Dematerialised Trading Through Depositories
- Approximately 120 Listings in Total
- Major Regional Companies Listed in More Than One Market



Regulatory Issues

- Harmonisation of Rules for Cross Listed Companies and Issues
- Surveillance of Trading Through the Automated Systems
- Insider Trading Cases Being Investigated
- Seeking to Sign on to IOSCO MMOU and Principles Evaluation

Regulatory Developments

- Comprehensive Legislative Review in Progress in Trinidad & Barbados
 - Trinidad Draft For Parliament 1st Quarter 2006
- Recent FSAPs Conducted in Barbados and Trinidad. Shortly in Jamaica
- Technical Assistance Project in Field on Market Surveillance, On-Site Inspections and AML

- Proposed Accession to IOSCO MMOU by Barbados, Jamaica, Trinidad 2006/7
 - Some Legislative Amendments Required
- Structures for Internal Regulatory Cooperation Implemented and Being Further Developed
- Formation of Association of Caribbean Securities Regulators to Foster Cross Border Cooperation
